



## GUIDELINES

### TEXT AND MANUSCRIPT

- Manuscript includes Title, Abstract, Summary and Captions in two separate files
- Text should be written in French or English compatible with Word: .doc, .docx, .rtf (but not .odt)
- Maximum length up to 8,000 words (without summary and illustration)
- Text style, table-list style and text style in illustrations is 12-point type in Times font, single line spacing, no text formatting
- Illustrations, Tables and Maps should be saved and provided in original file formats you used to create them (CorelDraw, Adobe Photoshop, etc.) exported .jpg (high) not compressed
- Do not exceed 10 illustrations.

Your contribution should consist of:

#### 1/ Main text file

- all author's name and affiliation, with name and e-mail address of corresponding author
- title of the paper (concise)
- substantial abstract up to 1000 words
- 7 keywords
- text (body) - Avoid footnotes, change to endnotes
- acknowledgments
- references

#### 2/ Illustrations (figures, tables, appendices, maps), each as a separate file xl, xls, tiff, jpg, psd.

labelled as for exemple : Antonovic\_Fig01.jpg

- Name of photographer must be written in the captions
- Type of scale or approx. length of the illustrated object must be written in the captions
- Do not place illustrations in the text
- Do not embed tables into text
- Original image quality is minimum 300 dpi
- Black and white or colour image are accepted
- Use format A4 (maximum size : 14.8 cm width x 24.7 cm length)

### QUOTATIONS

Referred author and references should be quoted as in this example:

“A theory developed by Zvelebil (Zvelebil, 1998), or in this theory (Zvelebil, 1998), and as for the other authors (David, 2000a; Richards & Macaulay, 2000:145, Fig.1-3) or the archaeologists concerned (Randoin et al., 1999 & 2000) ...” (de Dubois, 1995:155).

Radiocarbone dates in full when in text (data in different columns in Appendix):

Example : worked skull n°1, GrA-44332, 6335±40 BP (David et al., 2017), 5465-5218 calBC (calibration 95.4 % confidence Ox-Cal 4.2-86 ©Bronk Ramsey, 2014).
